HTD COURSES FOR Sheep & Ducks

HTD I

1. For the HTD I class, the handler may have the dog on lead while positioning it. The dog is positioned approximately even with the level of the panels (it may be further back, but no closer) and approximately in the center of the space between the two sets of panels. The handler may remain with the dog, or may leave the dog and take a position at any point on the course between the dog and the stock, but must stop short at least 15 ft. from the stock.
2. There must be a pause after the lead is removed, before the dog is sent to gather the stock. The handler shall signal the dog to begin the outrun, using any combination of voice, whistle, or movement. The outrun may be performed in either direction. When the dog reaches a position of balance with the stock, it may pause or briefly stop. The dog then fetches the stock to the handler's post. The handler may return to the post during the outrun, or may accompany the stock during the fetch. Flanking and/or stop commands may be given as needed to bring the stock successfully to the post.
3. Once the stock has reached the post, the handler should stand at the post while the stock is taken around the post. The stock should go to the right of the post if the first wear/drive panel is on the left, or vice versa. Stock are considered to have passed the post when they have crossed the line behind the post that would be a continuation of a line running lengthwise down the center of the arena from the set-out area to the handler's post.
4. When the stock have passed the handler's post, the handler may leave the post and accompany the stock and dog to the obstacles, which should be taken in the designated order.
5. The handler may take any position relative to the stock and dog, except that the handler should not go through the obstacles. If one or all of the stock pass an obstacle closely without going through, they should continue on to the next obstacle. Upon negotiating the second obstacle, the stock is taken to the pen.
6. In penning, after opening the gate the handler may move about and may assist the dog as needed, and need not hold the rope. The stock should be completely inside the pen before the gate is closed. All stock should be penned. The gate should not be slammed.

HTD II

1. The handler removes the lead just inside the limits of the course and brings the dog off lead to the handler's post. The handler may remain with the dog, or may take a position anywhere on the half of the course between the post and the line of the obstacles, not passing beyond the obstacles during the outrun, lift and fetch.
2. The handler sends the dog to gather the stock (the outrun may be done in either direction). When the dog reaches a position of balance with the stock, it may pause or briefly stop. The dog then fetches the stock to the handler's post. If not already at the post, the handler returns to the post ahead of the stock and dog, and stands there while the dog moves the stock past the post (see number 3 above for definition of passing the post). The stock should go to the right of the post if the first wear/drive panel is on the left, or vice versa. The handler may then leave the post and direct the dog to take the stock to the first obstacle.
3. As the stock are taken to the first obstacle; the handler may accompany the dog and stock, taking any position relative to them. Upon reaching the first obstacle, the handler may not go through or past the obstacle. While directing the dog to move the stock toward and through the second obstacle, the handler must remain behind an imaginary handler's line, which runs from the handler's post to the edge of the first obstacle nearest the center of the arena. The handler may remain near the first obstacle or may move back toward the handler's post so long as this line is not crossed before the stock have cleared the second obstacle. If one or all of the stock pass an obstacle closely without going through, they should continue on to the next obstacle. Once the stock has cleared the second obstacle, the handler proceeds to the pen.
4. In penning, after opening the gate the handler must hold the end of the rope attached to the gate. The handler cannot release the rope during penning, but may move about within its limits and may assist the dog. With cattle, the handler need not hold the rope. The stock should be completely inside the pen before the gate is closed. All stock should be penned. The gate should not be slammed.

HTD III

1. The handler removes the lead just inside the limits of the course and brings the dog off lead to the handler's post. The handler stands at the post while the dog is sent to gather the stock. After the outrun, lift and fetch, the dog moves the stock around the handler's post. The stock should go to the right of the post if the first wear/drive panel is on the left, or vice versa.
2. The dog drives the stock toward and through the first obstacle, then cross-drives toward and through the second obstacle. If one or all of the stock pass an obstacle closely without going through, they should continue on to the next obstacle. The handler remains at the post until the completion of the second obstacle. When the second obstacle has been negotiated, the handler may go to the pen.
3. In penning, after opening the gate the handler must hold the end of the rope attached to the gate. The handler cannot leave the gate or release the rope during penning, and should only assist the dog in penning through whistle, verbal or hand commands. With cattle, the handler need not hold the rope. Any handler who physically assists the dog in penning will have points deducted. The gate should not be shut until all the animals are completely inside the pen. All stock should be penned. The gate should not be slammed.
4. After penning, the animals should be removed from the pen and the gate closed. The dog and handler will then shed any two of the four sheep (any two of the five ducks) and hold those two apart from the others. This may be done anywhere within the roughly triangular area formed by handler's post and the panels. Once the judge calls the shed, the run is over.


AGREEMENT

I (we) acknowledge that the "Rules Applying to Registration and Dog Shows" and the "Rules for Herding Tests & Trials" have been made available to me (us) and that I (we) agree that the club holding this Herding Test or Trial has the right to refuse this entry for cause which the club shall deem to be sufficient. In consideration of the acceptance of this entry and of the holding of the Herding Test or Trial and of the opportunity to have the dog tested or judged and to win prize money, ribbons or trophies, I (we) agree to hold AHBA, San Pasqual Valley Herding Club, Southwestern Rottweiler Club of San Diego, or Action K9 Sports, their members, directors, governors, officers, agents, superintendents or show secretary and the owner or lessor of the premises and any employees of the aforementioned parties harmless from any claim for loss or injury which may be alleged to have been caused directly or indirectly to any person or thing by the act of this dog, where such loss, disappearance, theft, damage or injury, be caused or alleged to be caused by the negligence of the club or any of the parties aforementioned, or by negligence of any other person, or any other causes.



Outrun, Lift & Fetch (1)

Drive around Handler Cone and through Obstacle 2 (2)

Cross drive to Gate 1, Arena 2 (handler may leave post when cattle pass plane of Obstacle 2 panels) (3)

Move all 5 head through Arena 2 and into Arena 1

Sort 2 marked into Hold Pen (4)

Fetch/Drive remaining 3 into Exhaust Pen (5)

Sort 4 marked from Pen 1 (6) to Pen 2 (7) and into Arena 1


Drive "Y" Chute (8)

Move 4 head into Arena 2

Load into Trailer (9)

Tie Breaker for these courses will be Outrun, Lift, Fetch (Gather). Course time 22 minutes.

AHBA – HRD I & II Sheep



- **HRD I**
- 1 Handler/dog go into small sort pen and take the 10 sheep into Arena 2.
- 2 Sort any 5 sheep into Arena 1, take them to hay at Level 1&2 outrun 3.
- Dog at post 1; handler may go within 15 feet of sheep. Send dog to gather sheep.
- Gather sheep through obstacle 1, then obstacle 2, the long chute. All sheep and the dog must go into and through the chute.
- 4 Exhaust sheep into exhaust pen 1.
- 5 Return to Arena 2, gather 5 remaining sheep into Arena 1, and go directly to hold pen 6. Dog holds sheep in the 3-sided pen as handler enters and touches each sheep.
- Remove sheep from the hold pen, take them back into Arena 2, load them into trailer parked at gate 1.
- **BOLD numbers match circles.**
- **HRD II**
- 1 Send dog into small sort pen and take the 10 sheep into Arena 2.
- 2 Sort 2 marked sheep and any 3 others into Arena 1, take the 5 sheep to hay at Level 1&2 outrun.
- Dog at post 2; handler may go 1/2 way to the sheep. Send dog to gather sheep 3.
- Gather sheep through obstacle 1. Handler must remain at obstacle 1 while dog drives sheep to obstacle 2.
- Handler may proceed to obstacle 2 when the first sheep reaches the opening. All sheep and the dog must go into the chute. While the dog holds the sheep in the chute, the handler opens the gate at the exit, and dog must stay in the chute and push all sheep through the exit gate.
- 4 Exhaust sheep into exhaust pen 1.
- 5 Return to Arena 2, gather 5 remaining sheep into Arena 1, and go directly to the hold pen 6. Dog holds sheep in the 3-sided pen as the handler enters and touches each sheep.
- Remove sheep from the hold pen, take them back into Arena 2, and load them into trailer parked at gate 1.


Tie Breaker for these courses will be HRD I Sheep: Touch all 5 head in the pen.

Course time 12 minutes

Tie Breaker for these courses will be HRD II Sheep: Drive to the skinny chute.

Course time 15 minutes

AHBA – HRD III Sheep



HRD III

HRD III Outrun

- Handler stays at post in field while dog gathers 10 sheep **1**. Take all sheep through gate 1 into Arena 2. Sort 5 marked sheep into Arena 1.
- **2** Take sheep directly to and through obstacle 1. Handler remains at obstacle 1 while dog drives all sheep into obstacle 2 and enters the chute to hold the sheep. Handler proceeds to open the gate at the exit end of the chute. Dog pushes all sheep through the chute and exits after them.
- **3** Exhaust sheep into exhaust pen 1.
- **4** Return to Arena 2, gather 5 remaining sheep into Arena 1 and go directly to the hold pen. Dog holds the sheep in the 3-sided pen while handler enters and touches each sheep.
- **5** Take sheep back into Arena 2 and out gate 1 back into the field.
- Handler stays at gate 1 while the dog drives sheep through the far panels, then right turn clockwise around cone. When the sheep turn the cone, handler may proceed to the trailer. Load sheep into the free-standing trailer.

Bold numbers match circles

Tie breaker: Sort 5 marked from Arena 2 into Arena 1. Course time 20 minutes
